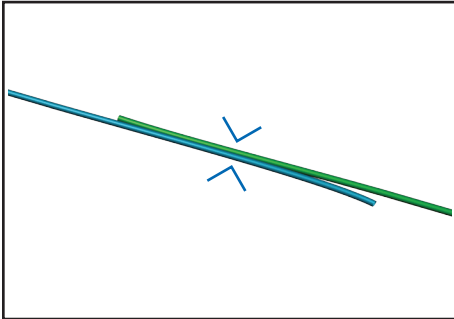
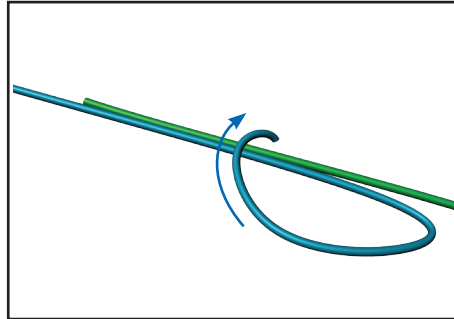


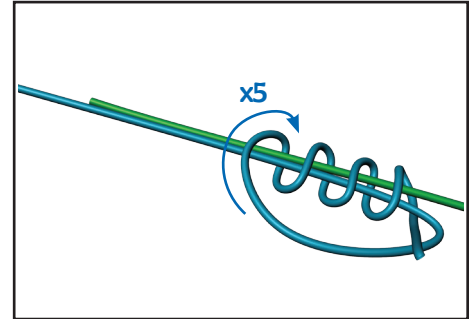
## Double Uni Knot



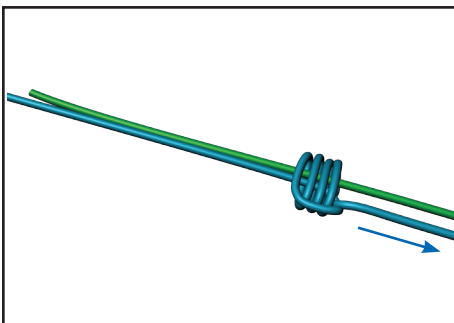
**Step 1** Align the two lines you wish to join. Pinch the two lines to form two tag ends of equal length.



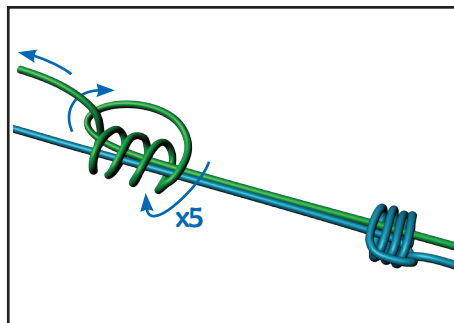
**Step 2** Take one of the tag ends and form a loop and cross it over the double stand.



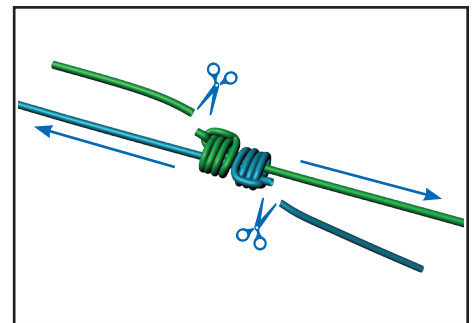
**Step 3** Wrap the tag end around the double stand five times.



**Step 4** Pull the tag end to form the first of the two uni knots.



**Step 5** Repeat the process with second tag end. Form a new loop over the double stand and wrap the tag end through the loop five times.



**Step 6** Pull the two standing lines and both uni knots will slide together. Trim the tag ends.

**Uses:** The Double Uni knot is a strong knot for joining two lines of similar diameters. The Double Uni Knot should not be used on lines with large degrees of line diameter variances. The greater the degree of change, the weaker the knot will be. In equal line sizes, tied correctly, the Double Uni Knot provides approximately 75 to 80 percent of line strength.

**Tying it:** It is important to wind the loops as a neat spiral round the standing lines. Hold the loops and the two standing lines under your fingers as you wind the line on.

**Advantages:** As the Double Uni knot is a slip knot it is one of the few fishing knots jigs can move freely on if the noose is not overly tightened.
